Proc	edure: 1.	 After reading Chapter 29, "Career Advice", ask students a. What kinds of work have they, or members of their family, done? (<i>Answers will vary</i>). a. Why do people work? (<i>To earn money, to do things they like, to help people, to make goods and provide services, to feel good.</i>) b. Why do people want money? (<i>To buy goods and services</i>) c. Ask students if they have been paid for work or chores. (<i>Answers will vary.</i>) d. Why are people paid for work? (<i>Answers will vary. Paid workers sometimes do a better job. You must pay people to get jobs done that people don't like to do</i>) 	
	2.	 Explain a. Income is the pay that people receive for working at a job. b. Goods and Services are what people who work at jobs produce. Ask, What is produced by a baker? (<i>Cakes, rolls, bread, etc.</i>) Are these goods or services? (<i>Goods</i>). Ask, What is produced by a teacher? 	

(*Learning, skills, knowledge*). Are these goods or services? (*Services*)

- c. Working people are **Human Resources.** Human resources (along with capital resources and natural resources) work to produce the goods and services in the economy.
- 3. Explain that we are going to play a game. Students will try to guess the occupation after the fewest number of clues.
- 4. Either a student can draw a card from the deck of Job Cards or the teacher can draw the card.
- 5. Read (or have a student read) the clues on the card one at a time. After each clue is read, the class tries to identify what the job is.
- 6. When a student identifies the job correctly, award a small prize or points toward a small prize.
